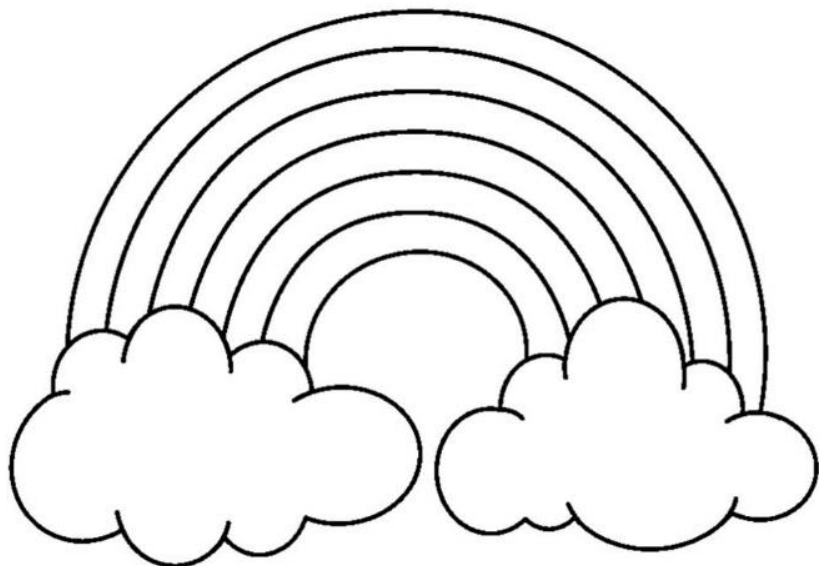


Falcon Class Homework – What are we fighting for? Peace and Conflict

Create a timeline of events that occurred in World War 2.	Create a fact file on the key countries involved in World War Two and their leaders. You can present this any way you choose (PPT, poster, mind map etc)	Research rationing and write a menu using those ingredients.	Design a poster persuading people to join the armed forces – look for examples online. E.g. Your Country Needs <u>You!</u>	Research a WW2 recipe and make it at home. Photograph the meal and write out the recipe. Write a review of the meal!	Free Task
