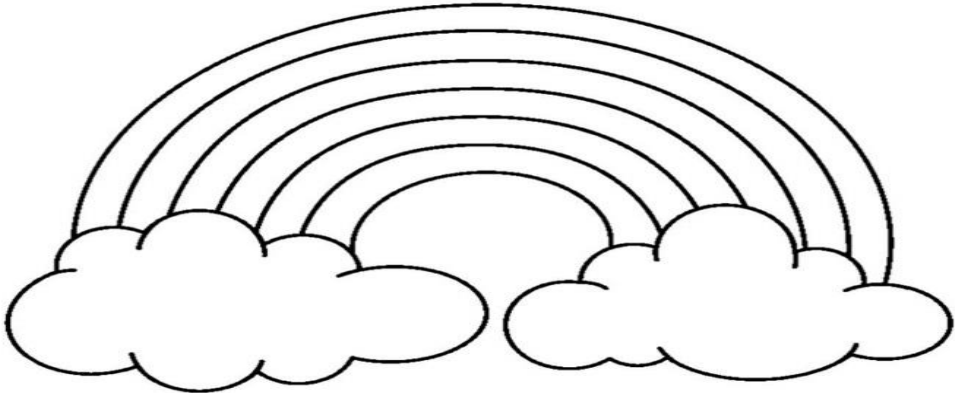


# Robin Class Homework Term 1
