Please can we strongly encourage parents to only put water in children's drinks bottles for school. Water is by far the healthiest option for children – not only from a dietary perspective but also because drinking fruit juice and squash regularly is one of the largest causes of tooth decay in children. The other problem that has been arising a lot recently is that water bottles, occasionally, get knocked over in class and if they contain squash, it leaves a sticky residue as well as a strong smell that is more difficult to clean up. All the staff thank you in advance for your support with this.

Parking outside the School

I am once again receiving lots of comments from concerned parents and members of the public about dangerous parking outside the school at pick up and drop off times. Whilst I appreciate that parking is difficult at those times, please can I ask parents not to park up on the yellow lines outside the school and drop children off – this is extremely dangerous due to the restricted view of the road caused by the railway bridge. We have also now not got railings out the front (a tractor knocked them over and KCC have said they cannot replace them!) that help prevent children running into the road. The Farriers Arms, at the bottom of the hill, have kindly said that parents are welcome to park in their car park for drop off and pick up. There are also other roads in the village, within walking distance, where it is safe to park for short periods. Please do park considerately for the safety of all those in the community.
