#### School Hours

Further to the information sent to parents on 3<sup>rd</sup> January about adjusting school hours to 32.5 hours per week in line with DFE expectations, I received written feedback from one member of staff and no written feedback from any parents. Following further discussion with staff, it has now been confirmed that from the start of term 6, i.e. 3<sup>rd</sup> June the following will apply:

- The start of the school day for **all** pupils will be 8:45am, with the school gate opening from 8:35am. Children will be marked as late if they are not in school at that time.
- The end of the school day for pupils in Key Stage 1 and 2 will be 3:15pm.
- The end of the school day for pupils in Year R will be 3:05pm, as it is currently.
